[You can complete the self-assessment and your implementation plan/plan of action whenever time permits, as long as they are submitted prior to their respective deadline. The self-assessment must be submitted and approved prior to submission of the implementation plan.](#)

Both of these programs are housed in one of our district schools. We view this as a school/community partnership and programming supported outside the school day as outlined in the grant components. [While these programs have proven effectiveness, I would encourage you to think in terms of sustainability. Since these are one time funds, we will be looking to see interventions \(e.g. training of trainers, -teacher, students, leadership etc.\) that will have lasting impact beyond these funds.
